Fiscal note status: This revised fiscal note reflects the introduced bill, as amended by the Senate Judiciary Committee.

Summary Information

Overview. The bill requires Colorado Integrated Criminal Justice Information System to provide certain information for the purposes of the automated protection order notification system.

Types of impacts. The bill is projected to affect the following areas on an ongoing basis starting in FY 2026-27:

- Minimal State Workload
- Local Government

Summary of Legislation

The bill requires the Colorado Integrated Criminal Justice Information System (CICJIS) to make certain information available to the Division of Criminal Justice (DCJ) in the Colorado Department of Public Safety (CDPS) for the purposes of the automated protection order notification system maintained by the DCJ.

Background

The [CICJIS](#) is a computer information system that is operated as a partnership among criminal justice agencies at the state and local level. The CDPS, the Judicial Department, the Department of Human Services, the Department of Corrections, local law enforcement agencies, and district attorney offices all provide data to this system.

State Expenditures

The bill increases workload for state agencies participating in the CICJIS to ensure they input required information. Additionally, workload will also increase in the CDPS to ensure the information from the CICJIS is made available to the automated protection order notification system. The overall increase in workload is expected to be minimal, and no change in appropriations is required.

Local Government

Workload will increase for local government agencies participating in the CICJIS. Similar to the state, the overall increase in workload is expected to be minimal.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect 90 days following adjournment of the General Assembly sine die, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
