SENATE RESOLUTION 21-007

101 **CONCERNING THE RECOGNITION AND REMEMBRANCE OF THOSE LOST**
102 **TO COVID-19 IN THE LATINO COMMUNITY.**

1 WHEREAS, As of June 8, 2021, Colorado has experienced
2 547,191 cases of COVID-19; 30,579 hospitalizations; and 6,783 deaths
3 due to the coronavirus; and

4 WHEREAS, Thousands of families and communities across our
5 state will never be able to celebrate holidays, attend their grandchildren's
6 school plays, or enjoy a meal together because this virus has robbed them
7 of those precious moments together; and

8 WHEREAS, This pandemic disproportionately impacted Black,
9 Brown, and Indigenous communities in Colorado. Earlier this year,
10 Latinos accounted for 22% of our state population but 42% of COVID-19
11 cases, 25% of deaths, and still constitute less than 10% of the vaccinated
12 population; and

13 WHEREAS, There are many socioeconomic factors, employment
14 as essential workers, and lack of access to healthcare and critical services
15 that are responsible for this disproportionate impact among our Black,
